Changes are Coming to the Concrete Channel!

Friends of Corte Madera Creek Watershed and the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, in partnership with College of Marin, are proposing to restore part of Corte Madera Creek by removing over half of the concrete channel walls downstream of the Stadium Way Bridge.
