State & Local Guidance



Blueprint for a Safer Economy Marin's Guide to Site Based Instruction

- Marin's status - Tier II - Red Substantial (9/15)
- Schools allowed to open per local public health guidance
- Marin County's 30 Point Guide - SSSPP (8/12)
- Physical Distancing - EPE/PPE - Stable Cohorts - Training - Hygiene Practices - Cleaning

Waiver Process

- Only required if in Tier I - Purple Widespread
- Approved School Site Specific Protection Plan
- Not required, KSD will not pursue

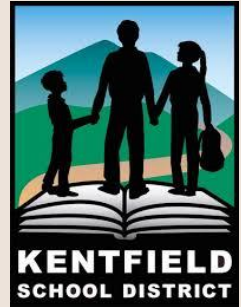

Transition to In-Person Instruction

What we know:

- Open Oct. 5 with Pilot Programs at each site
 - Students as Pioneers in this Pilot
- SSSPP Orientation for Staff, Students, Parents/Guardians
 - Webinar Overviews - On-Site Guidance/Tours
- A Phased Gradual Approach
 - Adjust in 2-week increments
- Announce student placement/cohort & the schedule
- Adhere to shifts in permissibility

Key Components:

Schedule may be Two Days In-Person/Three Days Distance Learning or 1 Week In-Person/1 Week Distance Learning

Daily schedule will remain the same for both cohorts: 8:30-1:00 (1-4); 8:30-12:00 (K)

Schedules will be staggered - arrival/dismissal, recess/snack, etc.

Distance Learning program will differ with a Hybrid approach

Continue opportunity for small group instruction

Increased social interaction with peers

A Day in the Life of a Kent Falcon



Key Components:

Schedule may be Two Days In-Person/Three Days Distance Learning or 1 Week In-Person/1 Week Distance Learning

Daily schedule will remain the same for both cohorts

Students will be in stable cohorts with homeroom teacher/s for entire day

During the day there will be live interaction with teacher and virtual instruction

Schedules will be staggered - arrival/dismissal, break/snack, etc.

Opportunity for small group instruction

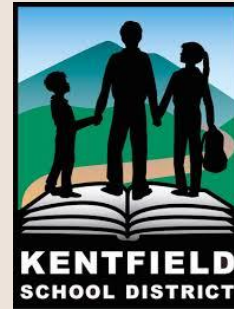
