Superintendent's Update



At its February meeting this week, the Board approved the 2017-18 District calendar. There were two main factors going into the development of this calendar. One was starting school after Labor Day to allow for the maximum number of days for Measure D summer construction and the other was aligning Winter and Spring breaks with the Tamalpais Union High School District's calendar to accommodate families' schedules.

The School Board was updated on the District's Social Studies curriculum. Sally Peck, representing Bacich, illustrated how students from TK-4th grade learn about ever widening social spheres, starting with themselves and their classrooms, and culminating in the study of the state of California and the famed Gold Country unit. Research and note-taking were the focus of the presentation by Peter Goetz, representing Kent, accompanied by four sixth graders - Athena Nguyen, Hana Moore, Bayanni Rivera, and Ellie Titcombe. The students demonstrated how to transform unfamiliar text into brief, comprehensible notes in preparation for the Egypt report.

The stalwart volunteer leaders of the campaign to pass Measure B, the District's Parcel Tax renewal measure on the November ballot, were recognized and thanked by the Board. While the measure was ultimately unsuccessful, there was nothing but praise for the job done by Connie and Jeff Zlot, Debra Fletcher, Ross McKenna, David Riedel and Mark Friedman.

Liz Schott reported on progress made to date on the District's annual goals. Our greatest areas of growth have been: 1) teachers learning about and implementing

innovative practices such as Project Based Learning, Arts Integration and Service Innovation; 2) increasing attention on student well-being including bullying prevention, cultural responsiveness, and social-emotional learning; 3) moving ahead with Measure D projects by hiring contractors, submitting plans to the State, and choosing a prefab building manufacturer for the classroom complex at Kent; and 4) working to pass the renewal measure for our Parcel Tax. There is much to be accomplished in the rest of the year, and good work has been done to date by our dedicated administrative, certificated, and classified staff.

Bacich Elementary School



Dear Parents,

I try to get to campus each morning between 7:30-7:45 a.m. I enjoy greeting the staff as they arrive at school and having a few moments of quiet time to organize myself before starting the day. Teachers use their early morning time to gather their mail from the staff room, collect last minute supplies, answer emails, and tidy their classroom, as they too get ready for a new day.

This week, like many others, I noticed a short line of cars lined up along the curb where parents drop their children, when I arrived on campus. These families are waiting for the clock to hit 8:00 a.m. before they allow their sons and daughters out of the car. I want to personally thank each of our parents who recognize that Bacich does not have any student supervision before 8:00 a.m. each school day and do not drop off or allow their children to be on campus before this time.

While teachers, the librarian, and the office staff are on campus before the start of school, they are not available to monitor and watch children who get to school early. Bacich does not have yard duty supervision until 8:00 a.m. Students should not be on campus before that time without a parent looking out for them.

Nor does Bacich provide after school student supervision. Parents must pick up or make arrangements for their children to be picked up immediately after school is dismissed. Students are welcome to stay on campus after school only when they are in the care of a parent or caregiver. These are not a new rules; they are clearly outlined in our [Bacich Parent Handbook](#).

From Ms. Canon's attendance calls first thing in the morning (if your child is absent and we haven't heard from you), to our insistence that the after-school programs keep close tabs on our students, to the rules that we have in place for our students before and after school - our concerns are for the safety of the very special people whom you entrust in our care each day. This is a very big job and we take it seriously.

We appreciate your help in keeping all of our students safe and in following the school rules.

California Helmet Law

In California, anyone under the age of 18 must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle on a street, bikeway, public bicycle path or trail. The law also requires anyone under 18 to wear a helmet when riding a scooter, skateboard, or when using inline skates.

All students in possession of a bike, scooter, or skateboard must have a helmet with them and use it to ride to and from school. Students violating this law will have their bike, scooter, skateboard, or skates held until their parents can come to school with their helmet. Local police officers may issue a \$25 fine for non-compliance.

Kent Gives Back

One of our greatest sources of pride at the Kentfield School District is how generously our students and families give back to our greater community. Whether it is a book drive, 5k run, or park clean-up, we can always count on our students to roll up their sleeves and work for a better community.

In November, Kent Middle School's T1 Service Innovation class, directed by Ms. Stephens, hosted an outstanding Community Kitchen dinner (check the kudos from our [December 1, 2016 newsletter](#)) raising approximately \$1900. KMS and T1 Service Innovation student Sven Neuschul shared with the class stories of his grandfather passing away because of pancreatic cancer and his desire to support cancer research. After reimbursing funders for start-up costs for the dinner, the class voted unanimously to donate half of the remaining dinner money (\$787) to cancer research. The other half of the proceeds created a fund to cover costs for future Community Dinners. Before Winter Break, Sven proudly delivered the big check to Dr. Eisenberg at Marin Cancer Care on behalf of his class.


