While the Kentfield School District does not plan to use pesticides in the coming year, in the event non-chemical methods are ineffective and a need arises following careful monitoring, all families and staff will be notified at least 72 hours before pesticides are applied. In the case of an emergency application, families and staff will be notified as soon as possible. Pesticides used in these circumstances will be those that pose the least possible hazard and are effective in a manner that minimizes risks to people, property and the environment.
