New Site Council members will be notified by Friday, June 1, 2018 and invited to attend the last Site Council meeting of the 2017-2018 school year for an official vote on Monday, June 4, 2018.

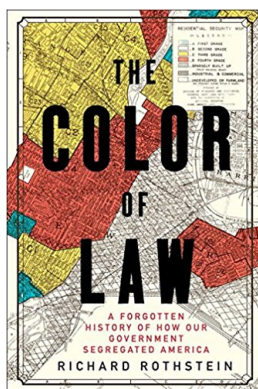

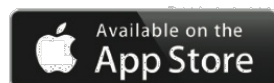
